Item 1: Call to order: 6:30 P.M.

Item 2: <u>Roll Call</u>: Chairman Leach Present, Selectman Cullett present, Selectmen Leach motion to move the meeting to the Community Center, recessed at 6:30 p.m.to move meeting down stairs to Community Center. 2-0

**Item 5:** <u>Update and discussion by the 250<sup>th</sup> Peru Celebration Committee:</u> Committee Member Kim Leach distributed a calendar for Peru's 250<sup>th</sup> celebration on July 16, 2022. A list of vendors was discussed, times for each event and the best area for each event. Lengthy discussion about possible parade, pony rides, and a car show.

- Lighting more than enough lighting at pavilion
- Staging-using car carrier instead of renting staging with steps. Town green may be used for guest speakers.
- Tents- 20' x 30' for \$ 420.00 at Carr Hardware, chairs and tables are \$2.00 each, Selectman Cullett will follow up with dig safe.
- White Wolf will be asked how many Porta Potties they recommend for 300 people.
- Beer and Wine not finalized.
- Earnie Hot Dogs will be a vendor
- Mr. Ding a Ling- will provide ice cream. No money exchange they keep the profit.
- Fire Department in charge of fried dough- the Board of Health will be contacted.
- Ozzie's Restaurant will provide a list of food options also Bulls and Basils plus Brick Oven Pizza.
- Lion Club spaghetti or pork dinner waiting for pricing
- Friday Dinner and block dance would work better to help vendors, but a band is needed.
- Fire chief, Pelkey brought up alcohol sales
- Encampment may have to set up Friday evening. Vendors need permit from their town
- Rain or shine the event will take place as scheduled.
- Jim Kenny has to order books- Selectman Leach estimated \$12.00 per book and mentioned that a free book given to each household would be a nice gesture.

- Possibility of ordering 500 books hard cover books, Jim Kenny suggested the front cover be a photo of the
  medallion and the back cover the back of the medallion. It was suggested that the Selectman write a page for
  the book, Selectman Leach has already given Jim Kenny names of the Peru Selectmen for the last 50 years.
- Time capsule to be opened in 50 years, suggestions for the time capsule: Program of events, face mask, covid test, thumb drive, bicentennial plate, medallion, money. Then the question about where the capsule should be buried was discussed.
- Music looking for bands
- Face painting need to buy supplies.
- Ninja jump obstacle course
- Chief Pelkey, suggested boy scouts could supervise fishing and archery games
- The field needs to be measured and Jim Kenny will make a map of the area with scheduled events
- Coralie Pelkey suggested a midnight alarm for kids, where the children are in a race to dress up with fire department member coats, boots and hats.
- Balloon twister Pittsfield \$295 for 3 hours plus a \$23.00 fee -this will take the place of a clown
- Pony rides come with their own liability insurance.
- Jim Kenny mentioned that there will be tours of the library, church and firehouse. The library will be open, and Coralie Pelkey will be in charge of a presentation-Women of 76 from 2:00 p.m. -3:30 p.m. The church will also be open for people to rest.
- Jim Kenny mentioned a one-day commemorative postmark cancelling stamps with a one -day Peru stamp. This would be great for the time capsule.
- T shirts Michelle Dewkett would have vendors on the back and front side Town of Peru 250 celebration was a suggestion
- Fireworks- Fire Chief Pelkey spoke with Camp Danbee, and it would be 50/50 split costing the town \$2,750.
- Grand Marshall- Paul Mark and George Greule were both discussed as the Grand Marshall.
- Boston Post Cane honors the oldest person in Peru and gets their name on a plaque.
- Craft vendors may leave a contribution -members stressed this is not a flee market.
- Member Kim Leach asked Selectman Leach and Selectman Cullet if they had any objections. At that point, a suggestion was made to change the block dance and have the entertainment as a community dinner and dance.
- Fire Chief Pelkey suggested Friday Dinner from 6:30 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. then dance and fireworks.
- A great way to end the parade is to have the 100 cars in the parade after the car show.
- Compactor closed Saturday, July 16<sup>th</sup>, 2022
- Finances: Accountant report \$25,980.83, there is a possibility that an additional \$10,000 will be needed from an appropriation at Annual Town Meeting. As of today, they do not have any sponsors.
- Selectman Cullett will need a drawing of the area with space for kids' program.
- Encampment area will be tents, campfire and guns.
- Veteran's tribute-It was mentioned that a fly over may be arranged although the department of defense has stopped funding due to the Ukraine situation. There may be a fly over if the Air Force is training the day of the event.
- Advertising will be done with flyers sent to Kittridge school for the children to bring home.
- John Bigelow suggested utilizing the boy scouts and girl scouts with the celebration to help earn badges.
- Signup sheet for people that want to work an hour or two are available
- Kim Leach reiterated that things may change at next meeting.
- Fire Chief Pelkey volunteered to sell beer on both days.
- Kim Leach thanked everyone involved with the celebration for hard work and dedication.
